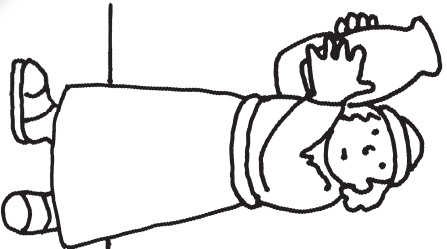


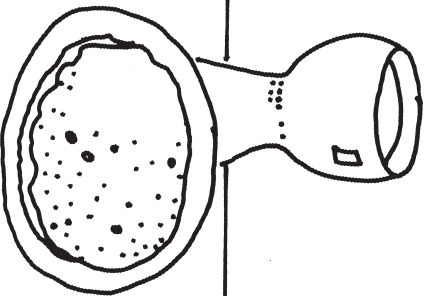
This is the bread,

At the last meal.



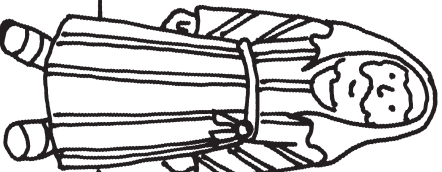
This is Jesus,

At his last meal.



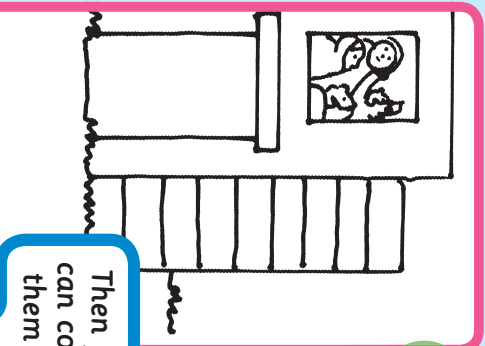
These are the friends,

what happened in the days
before Easter.
Luke 22:7-23

Children of this age can
appreciate the awe and
solemnity of this Bible
story, but the symbolism
of the broken bread and

**poured-out wine is still
beyond them.**

They cannot yet understand how
one thing can stand for another, the
broken bread for a broken body, the
poured-out wine for the spilt blood.
This understanding will come as
they grow older. In the meantime,
we can support their growth in faith
by helping them to realise that this
special meal was important – and
